	 Is the majority (90%) of the supplied text included on your site? (A few text items can be edited out for clarity, for example, if there's not enough information about frisbee golf to make a page about it, you might want to drop all references to that to build a sensible site.
	 Is the text broken up with an occasional image? (If the page is all text, it's not very appealing to a potential skier.) I'd go for at least four images per page.
	- Does the header and footer stretch across all screen sizes (100%), and does main stay in the center (having a max-width)?
	 Are the images actually sized to fit your plan? Please don't drop in the images without sizing them.
	- Does the site have one CSS file?
	 Are media Screens working? There should be three at a minimum.
_	- Has the text been carefully tagged? Are you using all of the text tags available to you (i, b, em, strong, etc)?
	- Is the metadata complete?
	 What level of interactivity has been added? Minimum interactivity is required (this includes making links change when hovering over them)
	- How well does your navigation work? Does it react to media screen size changes?
	- Are all pages linked, can a user easily get back and forth between pages, or are some links not working?
	 Consider adding any of the optional material to the site? (Weather widget, carousel, etc)
	 Does the site have a professional feel? Compare with the best ski resort sites you can find.
