
Objective



Then analyze one portfolio website as related to its construction, design, and ease of use. Then complete the same type of analysis for one physical portfolio case.

Overview

On the Web, usability is a necessary condition for survival. If a website is difficult to use, people leave. If the home page fails to clearly state what a company offers and what users can do on the site, people leave. If users get lost on a website, they leave. If a website's information is hard to read or doesn't answer users' key questions, they leave (Nielsen 2003). By completing this analysis of a site you will be better prepared to design successful websites.
